Andrew J. Hill is an Associate Professor of Philosophy at St. Philip's College in San Antonio, Texas, and during the academic year 2018 – 2019, he is a Fellow in the Global Studies Division of Stanford University. He earned a bachelor of arts degree in English and Philosophy from St. Mary's University, and a master of arts degree in Philosophy from the University of St. Thomas. He earned the Doctor of Jurisprudence degree from the Loyola University School of Law in New Orleans, which also awarded him the Gillis Long Poverty Law Center Community Service Award.

Hill has extensive higher education experience, including four years as the head of the Service Learning Center at St. Mary's University, where he was a Senior Lecturer of law and ethics in the Graduate School. During his appointment at St. Mary's University, Hill taught courses on international legal systems and on international law & treaties for the International Relations program.

In 2018, Hill received the NISOD Excellence Award for teaching, a national teaching honor from the College of Education at the University of Texas at Austin for his innovative teaching at St. Philip's College. He also taught philosophy at Northwest Vista College, which recognized him with the 2012 Excellence in Teaching Award.
