The Southwest Campus, a full-service component of St. Philip's College, serves a vital role as the South Texas region's primary center for technical and industrial training and education. The college prepares students pursuing an industrial or technical career through a certificate or an associate degree program. The Southwest Campus also provides education and training for employees facing career transitions and provides customized training for employers.

In 2010 the Campus underwent a multi-million dollar renovation, which included the student services area, the bookstore, the manufacturing technology lab and the library. The Centers of Excellence in Math and Science, a \$10 million project, opened in Fall 2010.

At St. Philip's College, we believe a student-centered culture fosters opportunities for learning, growth and individual excellence. A full spectrum of services designed to meet a wide range of student needs helps to create an environment that sets you up for success.

THE ACADEMIC ADVISING SERVICES area at St. Philip's College uses a progressive advising model with shared responsibility between students, faculty and academic advisors. This model helps students prepare to succeed in the workplace.

THE CAREER AND TRANSFER CENTER provides comprehensive information on career and transfer opportunities, including criteria for admission, on and off-campus housing, tuition, financial aid and scholarship information. The Center helps arrange university and college campus visits and provides information about transfer scholarships and transfer equivalency guides.

CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAMS are designed to meet the ever-changing needs of the San Antonio area workforce by offering programs for acquiring technical skills and courses to meet personal and professional goals. THE COUNSELING DEPARTMENT offers a wide range of services by licensed professional counselors, including educational planning, study skills techniques, academic advising, student success classes and college orientation. Limited assistance is provided for substance abuse counseling and crisis and personal counseling.

THE DEPARTMENT OF STUDENT LIFE supports the academic mission of the college by engaging students in a variety of activities which enhance the college experience. These activities include student organizations, campus events, recreation, intramural sports and social development opportunities.

THE DISABILITY RESOURCE CENTER provides reasonable academic support and accommodations to eligible students through access to the latest information and technologies.

THE FIRST YEAR EXPERIENCE CENTER provides special services to help retain students attending college for the first time. These services include advising, book loans, new student orientation and referral to community family resources. First year students also have access to laptop and calculator loans, a newsletter, student seminars and childcare scholarships.

THE INSTITUTIONAL ADVANCEMENT SCHOLARSHIP OFFICE assists students in securing scholarships.

THE SERVICE LEARNING PROGRAM allows students to learn and develop various skills and abilities by participating in meaningful service projects to help address community needs. Recent studies have shown that service learning improves student academic success and retention.

STUDENT FINANCIAL SERVICES assists students in securing financial aid through loans, grants and work-study programs.

THE TUTORING AND TECHNOLOGY (TNT) CENTER provides a range of student academic support services with free professional and peer tutoring in more than 15 subject areas and state of the art equipment, including WI-FI Wireless Internet and 50 computers.
